



CITRUS DANCE

Behaviour Management Policy

RATIONALE:

Citrus Dance strives to create a safe and supportive learning environment where meaningful relationships are established and support is provided by all members of the community. Student wellbeing is a high priority and is maintained as a shared responsibility of Citrus Dance and community.

AIMS:

- To approach the management of student behaviour as a shared responsibility between home and Citrus Dance
- To promote a positive environment and sense of belonging based on positive behaviour, mutual respect and cooperation
- To promote a positive approach to behaviour management where self discipline and responsibility are developed
- To encourage students to develop cooperative attitudes and respect for themselves and others
- To encourage all members of the community to treat each other with respect and courtesy
- To create a culture where bullying and harassment is not tolerated

IMPLEMENTATION:

- Staff induction will include an overview of all Citrus Dance policies and all staff working at Citrus Dance will adhere to the guidelines in the Staff Code of Conduct
- Managing inappropriate behaviour in a positive and professional manner
- To be consistent and fair when applying consequences for behaviour
- To establish clearly understood and logical consequences for student behaviour through the Behaviour Management Process
- Display Behaviour Management Process in all studios and place in easily accessible locations for staff
- Ensure parents have access to the Behaviour Management Process via our website and in hardcopy at the studio
- Teachers promote and develop positive relationships with students that are based on the Citrus Dance values and students rights to be safe, to be respected and to learn
- Teachers will manage conflict by speaking with the students involved. The perpetrator will receive a warning. If a child receives 2 warnings within the same class, they will be asked to sit out for 5 minutes. If the behaviour continues once they have joined in the class again, they will be asked to leave the class in order to speak to the studio directors. If a child is asked to leave the class, a parent meeting will be called by the studio directors. If the behaviour continues after the parent meeting, it is at the discretion of the studio directors to take further action, potentially resulting in the child being asked not to return to Citrus Dance
- Teachers will give verbal reminders to students in regards to expected behaviour
- Teachers will encourage students to be assertive and to seek adult assistance if they need help with conflict situations
